Overview of New Jersey's Distribution Model

- -Annual Survey/Diversion Process
- -Orders placed based off demand
- -Allocation offerings made available monthly based off fair share
- Accepted allocations picked up by SFA at State contracted warehouses





Together to Nourish the Natio



The goal of the Food Distribution Unit is to accept and distribute the maximum volume of USDA donated commodities to various eligible recipient agencies (RAs) by selecting USDA foods (types and volume), which can be fully utilized by NJ's recipient agencies.

High Inventory Turnover

Benefits of Quick Inventory Turnover

- Higher Quality Product
- Reduced Storage Costs
- Reduced Waste
- Marginal Loss





- Obstacles to Inventory Turnover
 - -Ordering Periods
 - -Ordering Requirements
 - -Change in Demand
 - -Food Distribution System
 - -Quick Turn Arounds/Acceptance of Bonus Offerings

Best Practices to Keep Inventory Moving




- Self-Evaluate
- Maintain an Inventory History
- Demand Driven Distribution Model
- Order Quarterly (when applicable)
- Split Shipments with Other States
- Develop Relationships with SFAs
- Network with Neighboring States
- Monthly Warehouse Inspections
- Ramp up and down Warehouse Inventory
 - Introduce new products slowly
 - Seek SFA Feedback
 - Sweeps



State Entitlement from USDA for ordering TEFAP Foods

- -Entitlement Ordering
- -Bonus Ordering (section 32 Funds)
- -Commodity Credit Corporation (CCC TE)

TEFAP Entitlement Ordering - Example

KY Entitlement Breakdown

- -Order IDIQ fruits and vegetables first
- –Divide the remaining funds by 4 quarters
- -Order Jan-June first by the order dates in WBSCM
- -Order the remaining funds for July-December





Bonus Workflow

- Emails are sent to states with fair share offering
- Surveys are released in WBSCM to states
- <u>States can roll surveys down to food banks or warehouses</u>

Commodity Credit Corporation Offering (CCC_TE)

- Emails are sent to states with fair share offering
- Surveys are released in WBSCM to States
- State can roll surveys down to food banks or warehouses



TEFAP Inventory Management

Annual Inventory at the Warehouses (Food Banks)

- No more than 6 months of inventory
- Example of Annual **Inventory review**

Communication to the Food Banks

- All KY food banks have access to WBSCM
- All KY food banks have a say in what and when they receive Bonus and CCC Funds offerings

- **Request to Transfer TEFAP** foods between Food Banks
- Each food bank can request a transfer to another food bank at their expense

CSFP Ordering

Two ways to receive USDA CSFP Foods

- **1.** Direct ships Full truckload of one item to meet CSFP box requirements
- 2. Multifood shipments USDA contracts with larger warehouses - Allows for lower caseload agencies to consolidate USDA foods on one truck



Quarterly orders for Direct Delivery

KY has two food banks that order full trucks

Monthly Orders For Multifood Orders

All food banks order from the Multifood Warehouse

Caseload for KY 35,259
